# omposition

## **Siblical Insight**

The invention of the printing press had a great impact on Christianity. Previously, the Bible had been laboriously copied by hand. Only the rich could afford a copy of God's Word. But that changed in the fifteenth century. Thanks to the movable-type printing press of Johann Gutenberg, common people could afford to buy a book. The Mazarin Bible, completed no later than 1455, is thought to be the first book printed in Europe.

Surely God showed His grace in providing the printing

press. Even though printing quickly became used in the reproduction of non-Christian books, the underlying plan of God cannot be ignored. We are reminded in Psalm 111:7,8, "The works of his hands are faithful and just; all his precepts are trustworthy. They are steadfast for ever and ever, done in faithfulness and uprightness." Now the Bible is found on the Internet, on video, on paper, and heard over the radio. It is amazing to think that just one-hundred years ago most of this was impossible; the availability of the printed word was not anywhere close to the availability of the Word of God today.

## iscussion

A major significance of biblical discoveries such as the Dead Sea Scrolls has been to reaffirm the amazing accuracy of our Bible translations. Manuscripts much older than any previously known have matched with meticulous consistency the much younger texts. What does God's great concern for even the tiniest detail of the preservation and translation of His Word demonstrate about His care for us?
