Ezra LEADERS LESSON OVERVIEW—Lesson 4



FOR THE LEADER

In this lesson, we will learn that we should always worship God without worrying about what other people might think of us.

KEY POINT

We should worship God in all situations.

KEY THOUGHTS

KEY POINT

We should worship God in all situations.

Ezra 3:3



READ

When the seventh month came and the Israelites had settled in their towns, the people assembled together as one in Jerusalem. Then Joshua son of Jozadak and his fellow priests and Zerubbabel son of Shealtiel and his associates began to build the altar of the God of Israel to sacrifice burnt offerings on it, in accordance with what is written in the Law of Moses the man of God. Despite their fear of the peoples around them, they built the altar on its foundation and sacrificed burnt offerings on it to the LORD, both the morning and evening sacrifices. Then in accordance with what is written, they celebrated the Festival of Tabernacles with the required number of burnt offerings prescribed for each day. After that, they presented the regular burnt offerings, the New Moon sacrifices and the sacrifices for all the appointed sacred festivals of the LORD, as well as those brought as freewill offerings to the LORD. On the first

day of the seventh month they began to offer burnt offerings to the LORD, though the foundation of the Lord's temple had not yet been laid, Ezra 3:1-6

The people who returned to Jerusalem to worship God didn't have it easy. Enemies were all around. These enemies didn't want the city rebuilt. They didn't want the Temple restored.

The people rebuilt the altar first. It was used to offer sacrifices to God. The people's priority was to worship God.

The people knew that if they focused on God, He would rescue them from their enemies. They were not worried about what the people around them thought. They were determined to show their love to God.

We often worry about what others think of us when we worship God. We fear people will

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make fun of us. But God doesn't want us to fear what others might think or do. He wants our priority to be worshipping Him and enjoying His presence.

We also sometimes let things take our focus away from God. Sometimes our problems or plans distract us. And sometimes we may get bored. But, we must keep our focus on God, not on things.

Make worshipping God your priority this week by setting aside time each day to be with Him. When you worship around others, don't worry about what they think, but focus your worship on pleasing God.



As a group, discuss the following questions.

- Why should worshipping God be the main priority for our lives?
- · Why do some people worry about what others think when they worship?
- What are some things that distract us when we try to worship God?

Review the Key Point and the Key Verse.

PRAYER: Dear God, thank You that You love me. Please help me to keep You my top priority. Amen.



Take time in your group to worship God. Encourage the boys not to be distracted or to worry about what others think, but help them focus on the presence of God.
