- **Note:** You must comply with your state's licensing procedure before operating a motorboat for this merit.
 - 1. Complete the following:
 - a. List the first aid equipment and supplies that should be on a motorboat.
 - b. List the safety devices that are required on a motorboat according to federal and state regulations.
 - c. List the federal requirements for ventilation, fire extinguishers, and backfire flame control. Explain why these requirements are needed. List your state's regulations if different from the federal regulations.
 - d. Describe how the hazards of weather and wave-swell conditions can affect both safety and performance in motorboating. List ways to ensure that no adverse weather conditions are developing when taking your motorboat out on a lake.
 - 2. Demonstrate your ability to wear, adjust, and use a personal floatation device.
 - 3. Demonstrate your knowledge of the preparation needed for operating a motorboat by making the following inspections prior to leaving the dock.
 - a. Check for the required safety devices that must be in the boat, including fire extinguishers, floatation devices, anchor, etc.
 - b. Check the operation of the lights and horn.
 - c. Check the operation of the controls, such as steering.
 - d. Check the amount of fuel in the tank(s).
 - e. Check all fuel lines for signs of damage, kinks, cracks, or other unsafe conditions.
 - f. Check the battery connections to ensure that they are tight and not corroded.
 - g. Check the propeller to make sure it looks right with no bends, looseness,

etc., and that no debris is tangled in the propeller. Check that the propeller	r
is locked down properly in the running position.	

- h. Check the motor prior to starting. Take the cover off and look for abnormal conditions, including leaks, loose parts, loose or disconnected wires, etc.
- i. Start the motor and warm it up after an "all clear." Notice if it sounds normal. Check for any leaks, such as exhaust fumes, fuel, water, etc.
- 4. Demonstrate your knowledge of the operation of a motorboat. You must have a state license or permit in your possession.
 - a. Demonstrate how to properly get into a boat.
 - b. Start the motor and get under way from the dock or beach.
 - c. Operate the boat in a straight line for a quarter of a mile.
 - d. Make right and left turns, then make a U-turn.
 - e. Stop the boat and shut off the engine, drop and raise the anchor, then get under way again.
 - f. Come alongside a dock. Moor the boat and tie it up.
 - g. Beach the boat; tie it up so it will not drift back into the water.
- 5. Explain each of the following:
 - a. How to prepare a boat hull for winter or seasonal storage
 - b. How to store the gear, such at life jackets, etc.
 - c. How to prepare the motor for winter
