Jesus spent 3 years in close contact with twelve very different disciples. Matthew was a despised tax collector. Peter was an overanxious stick-your-foot-in-your-mouth fisherman. John and James cared only about their position in the coming kingdom. To some, these men were misfits, and a riot about ready to erupt. Yet, somehow Jesus was able to maintain good strong ties with them, while developing friendships with Mary, Martha, Lazarus, and many others. He washed their feet, told them the most private information, and trained them

to become effective evangelists and leaders. And lastly, He sacrificed himself to death on a cross so they could enjoy the fruit of eternal life.

Jesus exhibited all of the qualities listed in the Composition section, and many more not discussed here. His behavior stands in stark contrast to so many friendships that depend only on money, power, position, or temporary
