20. Explain the elimination system used in Olympic archery competition.
21. Qualify as a Bowman or above (Junior Archer, Archer, Master Archer, etc.) as a member of the NAA's Junior Olympic Development Program (JOAD) OR using a recurve, longbow, or compound bow, shooting bare bow style with a finger release, shoot 30 arrows ( 10 rounds of 3,6 rounds of 5 , or 5 rounds of 6 ) making the following scores on any ONE of the following:
a. Using an 80 cm target at 15 yards, make a minimum score of 150 points.
b. Using a 60 cm target at 12.5 yards, make a minimum score of 150 points.
c. Using a 60 cm target at 15 yards, make a minimum score of 125 points.
d. Using a 40 cm target at 10 yards, make a minimum score of 150 points.
e. Using a 40 cm target at 15 yards, make a minimum score of 100 points.
f. On an NFAA field round of 14 targets make a score of 140 points.
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
